1. Tap the AppStore app on your Home Screen



2. Tap the Magnifying Glass on the top



3. Start typing **Libby** and then tap the **Libby**, **by Overdrive** result



4. Tap the **Get** button next to **Libby** 



5. Tap **DOWNLOAD** 



6. Tap **OPEN**







# **Borrowing a Book**


1. Tap the Magnifying Glass on the bottom left



2. Tap **SEARCH...** at the **top** 




- 3. Start typing the title or author of a book

- 3. Tap Continue



- 4. Type your amazon password
- 5. Tap Sign In

7. Tap the circle at the bottom to get to the Home Screen



8. Tap Library at the top

3. To exit the book, tap < Back in the top left




# **Returning an Item Early**


1. Tap **Shelf** at the **bottom**

4. Tap Return!



1. Tap Shelf at the bottom




2. Tap the **Holds** tag at the **top**

## 2. Tap Add Library




