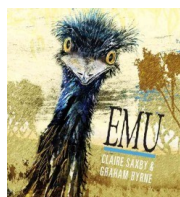

This full-color book teaches kids that birds can be seen almost anywhere: in city parks and streets, zoos, farms, and backyards.

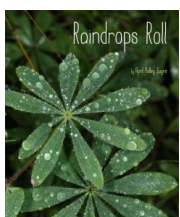


Emu

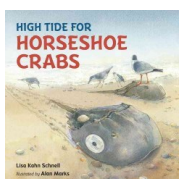


Raindrops Roll

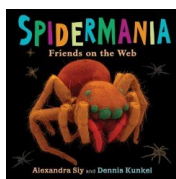


High Tide For Horseshoe Crabs

Debunking myths about spiders, this book takes an extremely close look at creatures that have both fascinated and terrified humans.

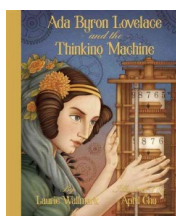

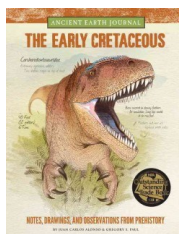


Welcome to Mars: Making A Home On The Red Planet

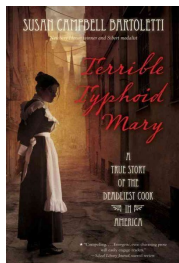


The Early Cretaceous Period: Notes, Drawings, And Observations From Prehistory

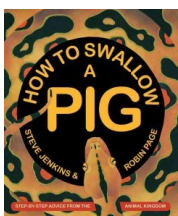

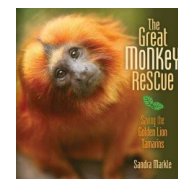


Little Puffin's First Flight

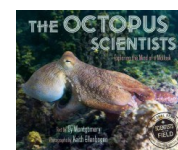

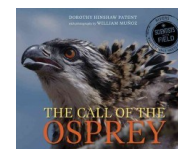


The Octopus Scientists: Exploring The Mind Of A Mollusk
